

**RAIDERS AND CHARGERS ANNOUNCE THAT CARMEN POLICY WILL ASSIST THE TEAMS' JOINT EFFORT TO DEVELOP THE NEW LOS ANGELES NFL STADIUM IN CARSON**

*The Chargers-Raiders Joint Venture, Which Began on February 20<sup>th</sup>, Has Now Resulted in a Fully Entitled Stadium Site*

[Carson CA – May 18, 2015]--The Oakland Raiders and San Diego Chargers have named Carmen Policy as Director of Carson Holdings, LLC, where Mr. Policy will help direct the teams' joint Los Angeles stadium efforts. Mr. Policy is the NFL executive who is best known for his work in the front office of the San Francisco 49ers, a franchise that won four Super Bowls during his tenure.

Working directly with Raiders owner Mark Davis and Chargers owner Dean Spanos, Mr. Policy will help advance the teams' joint efforts to develop the new Los Angeles Stadium in Carson and to ensure the successful re-entry of the teams and the NFL into the Los Angeles marketplace.

In particular, Mr. Policy will enable the two teams to speak with one voice both to the Los Angeles market and to the NFL. The stadium development experts that have been jointly assembled by the Raiders and Chargers have already secured full entitlements for the Los Angeles stadium in Carson.

In addition, both the Chargers and Raiders are determined to make the long-awaited re-introduction of the NFL into the Los Angeles market a tremendous success, and Carmen Policy will now assist with this joint effort as well.

"The two teams have made remarkable progress so far. Since announcing the Los Angeles Stadium plan for Carson on February 20, the teams have – in less than three months – achieved widespread community support for the project and all of the entitlements that are necessary to begin construction. It has been an enormously successful effort," said Carmen Policy. "Now, though, both Mark Davis and Dean Spanos have recognized that the teams are entering a new phase of the process. The focus will now shift away from development entitlements and on to how the teams can guarantee a tremendously successful re-entry of the NFL into the Los Angeles market. The two owners are determined to make the League's return to Los Angeles a fantastic success, and I'm honored that Mark and Dean believe I can assist in this important work. I am excited to do so."

"Our first priority remains – as it has always been – to find a solution in Oakland," said Raiders owner Mark Davis. "But if we are unable to achieve this goal, we must have an alternative that will safeguard the long-term future of our franchise. And our proposed Los Angeles stadium in Carson is just such an opportunity for the Raiders."

Chargers owner Dean Spanos continued: “We are fortunate to be able to work with Carmen Policy on our Los Angeles alternative, which we would turn to in the event that our 14-year-long effort in San Diego does not produce results. Carmen is a legendary figure in the history of the National Football League, and there is no better person to help us promote the return of the NFL to Los Angeles and make it a fantastic success.”

Carmen Policy concluded: “I’ve followed the NFL’s efforts in Los Angeles over the years, and I’m quite familiar with the Carson site. Indeed, the NFL has attempted on its own to purchase the site on three separate occasions -- and for good reason. The Carson site is ideally positioned to attract fans from both Los Angeles and Orange Counties, two of the largest and most economically vibrant markets in the entire world. The Carson site is right next to major freeways that connect the site to all of Southern California, so it will be easy for fans to reach the site, and to enter and exit the site quickly. In my experience, especially in California, this is of paramount importance to fans. What’s more, the entire site will be devoted to the game day experience, with enough space for ample on-site parking and unparalleled tailgating opportunities. NFL Sundays in LA will be one of the best game day experiences in all of sports, and I am thrilled to be part of this effort.”
